The IRS Said YES to UPLIFT



After months of patiently (well, mostly patient waiting), we have a favorable determination from the IRS relative to UPLIFT's status as a 501(c)(3) organization. Our determination letter is dated January 4, 2022, and technically our status was effective October 7, 2021. UPLIFT will continue its relationship with Senior Friendship Centers until UPLIFT has sufficient internal resources to manage the financial aspects of its operations. We completed our 2022 strategic planning process and identified four key strategies for the year, as follows:

- Launch and support the growth of UPLIFT villages
- Develop and implement the operational functions of the hub organization, support village development, and advance strategic relationships
- Expand revenue streams to enhance and achieve financial sustainability
- Strengthen and grow the CallConnect Program

My reason for telling the story lies in the friendship I developed with the couple's daughter. Over the past two years, I have regularly communicated with her through email and phone calls. We developed a long-distance friendship beyond the needs of mom and dad. We check in on each other to see how things are going, and of course, we still check in on mom and dad. The friendship started with a need but developed into something more meaningful - an outlet for conversation, a friend to listen to when things weren't going as planned, and a human connection with someone who cared.
